REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES



VOLUNTEERS IN THE SCHOOL

A **Criminal Background Check – Vulnerable Sector Screen** is required to be completed for any volunteer work in the school, including Catholic School Council, All Star Reading coach, pizza days, and parent supervisors for *class trips*. There are no exceptions to this rule, and we recommend that parents apply for a CBC-VSS early if they wish to attend a class trip as a supervisor. If there are multiple parent volunteers for a particular trip, the teacher will inform parents about who will accompany the class.

The original CBC-VSS must be dated within 6 months, and once you have a valid and original CBC-VSS on file in the Office, then you do not have to obtain another one, as long as you complete an *Annual Offence Declaration* **each school year** to remain on our approved School Volunteer List. NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER

November 5-11 - Treaty Recognition Week

The first full week in November is marked as Treaties Recognition Week. This is an opportunity to recognize and understand the importance of treaty education and to help everyone in Ontario learn about treaty.

November 5-11 - Veterans' Week (National)

November 7 - International Inuit Day

This is a day to recognize the vibrant culture and rich history of Inuit communities in Canada and around the world.

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November 8 - Indigenous Veterans Day

Did you know that November 8th is marked as Indigenous Veterans Day? For over years, Canadians have set aside the 11th Day of November to remember the sacrifices of soldiers who fought for Canada and the British Commonwealth in global conflicts that took place in foreign lands. Most Canadians are not aware of the contributions made by Indigenous Warriors in those military campaigns, nor of the crucial role they played during the War of 1812 -- the only war ever fought on Canadian soil.

November 11 – Remembrance Day

Canadians pause today in silence to remember those who died in war and to pray for the victims of aggression and inhumanity throughout the world. This is a day to pray for peace, to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community and as a nation to bring God's peace into the world.

KISS AND RIDE SAFETY

Families are encouraged to use active transportation by walking to school. If you choose/need to drive your child(ren) to school, please try to ensure that they are ready to exit the vehicle in Kiss and Ride, and that they exit on the passenger side for safety. Students using Kiss and Ride should be able to exit the vehicle on their own. Drivers should remain in their vehicle if using Kiss and Ride lane, pause for child(ren) to exit safely, then continue through to allow other cars to move in single file. If parent/guardian needs to get out of the driver's seat and/or wants to escort their child(ren) to the schoolyard, then they should *park their car (no parking in Kiss and Ride lane)*. Please avoid parking in designated Fire Route areas, including Kiss and Ride lanes. Do not block buses or cars at the driveway entrance. STOPR has contacted the school because buses are not able to enter the Kiss and Ride lane, and the City of Mississauga Crossing Guards have also expressed concerns about student safety at the driveway entrance. Your cooperation is appreciated for the safety of all, as these rules apply to all schools' Kiss and Ride lanes.

- ⇒ Equal power – mutual engagement
- ⇒ Equal emotional reaction
- ⇒ Happens occasionally
- ⇒ Can be accidental
- ⇒ Not seeking power or attention
- ⇒ Feelings of remorse and responsibility
- ⇒ Effort to solve problem

BULLYING

- ⇒ Imbalance of power – one sided
- ⇒ Strong emotional reaction on part of the victim
- ⇒ Happens repeatedly
- ⇒ Intentional, threatening
- ⇒ Seeking power and control
- ⇒ No remorse – blames victim
- ⇒ No attempt to stop

In addition to Board Policy, the passing of *Sabrina's Law* serves as a reminder of the seriousness of anaphylactic reactions. As there are a number of students in our school who have a severe life-threatening allergy to nuts/tree nuts, we continue to remind our families to **refrain from sending to school any food that contains nut products** (i.e. peanut butter, snacks with nuts, etc.) We are mindful that some children also have dietary restrictions.
